## **FSM applications:**

Don't forget that children in yr3 upwards have to pay for their school dinners (£2.30 a day). This must be paid for on Parent Pay and you need to ensure that you keep up to date with all payments please.

**Your child can get free school meals** if your combined annual household income is below £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC) and you get one of the following benefits:

- income-based: income support or jobseeker's allowance (not eligible if on contribution based jobseeker's allowance)
- income-related: employment support allowance (not eligible if on contribution based employment support allowance)
- universal credit
- income support
- the guaranteed element of state pension credit
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- child tax credit only.

Please note that Lewisham do not pay off any meals paid for before you apply and you will be responsible for paying off any debts to us for any meals eaten this term, or previously. It is therefore really important that you do the following things if you are struggling to pay the £2.30 per day costs:

- 1. Start your child on pack lunches now you MUST inform the office that you are doing this or they will continue to charge you. It is best to email them on admin@haseltine.lewisham.sch.uk
- 2. Apply for FSM with Lewisham ASAP, the quicker you apply, the quicker you will get everything your child is entitled to (don't forget that your child can get music lessons for free at Haseltine if they are FSM; free breakfast club from 8am & discounted trips amongst other benefits)

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There are 42 rights for children in total but as a school, we have focus on 12 rights in particular, as chosen by our Rights Respecting Team (made up of children):

- 2: Every child has the right to live and grow
- 7: Every child has the right to an identity a name and a nationality
- 13: Every child has the right to an opinion and to be listened to
- 15: Every child has the right to friendship
- 19: Every child has the right to be safe
- 22: Every child has the right to safety & protection in their new country if they are a refugee
- 23: Every child has the right to the right kind of education and support if they have special needs or disabilities
- 24: Every child has the right to healthcare & nutritious food
- 28: Every child has the right to a good education
- 30: Every child has the right to learn & use the traditions, language & religion of their own family
- 31: Every child has the right to play & rest
- 32: Every child has the right to be protected from harmful work

Some of these rights relate, directly, to all children and some may be more specific when learning about different parts of the world.

We have currently achieved the Bronze level of accreditation and we will hopefully be achieving Silver later this year. I will be 'testing' your children in assembly on Monday on how many of these rights they can remember from last year – by discussing these rights with them this weekend, you will give them a headstart ©
