Phones in school

I have spotted a few adults on phones in the playground during drop off & pick up times. Please can I remind you (or tell you, if you haven't heard me say this before) that phones are not allowed in school — either texting/using apps/using internet/talking on the phone.



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The reason for this is because of safeguarding. I will have to tell you to come off the phone if I see you on it. Thank you for helping to keep all our children safe.

The Hub:

We are really fortunate to have a space here at Haseltine that our parents can access called The Hub. We use this space for a wide range of things such as: coffee mornings, workshops, Stay and Play sessions and meetings.

One of our amazing parents, Stacey, has agreed to open The Hub every Tuesday & Wednesday between 9 and 11.30am for ANY parent to come along for a coffee and a chat. Younger brothers & sisters are more than welcome too, there are lots of things to play with and Stacey is also talking about having creative sessions for children too. Don't be shy, please just come along - Stacey is desperate for people to come and join her ©

From a safeguarding point of view, I do have to say that parents/carers/siblings are only allowed in our Hub and to use the adult toilet on the decking, they are not allowed to be in the playground or other parts of the school. Thank you.

Clubs at Haseltine:

The way that we organise & run clubs at Haseltine this year is going to be slightly different. If a teacher wants to run a club, they will send out letters to children in the particular year group and you will apply directly to them.

People who run the outside clubs: Taekwondo, football & the dance clubs, will also liaise with you directly. Children who were in Taekwondo & dance last year will continue again this year, unless you tell the tutors otherwise – you do not need to re-apply.
