

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Can I please remind you that if your child would like to go to the above clubs you need to book and pay for the session in advance via the Arbor App. If you do not have your log in details you can get this from the school office.

After School Club cost is: From 3.30pm – 6.00pm cost is \pounds 12 per session, siblings \pounds 10.00 per session From 3.30pm – 4.15pm cost is \pounds 4.00

Breakfast Club cost: From 7.30am – cost £4.00 per session From 8.00am – cost £3.00 per session

Please note: The charge of £4.00 will also be applied in all cases of late collection.

Your child will not be able to attend either club if you have outstanding money owing on your account. Please do not just drop your child at either of the above clubs if your account is in arrears.
